Conditions of Admission to Studies in the Accredited English Master Study Programme Business Economics

Admission Procedure

The admission of an applicant for studies at the Faculty of Economics and Management is done according to the decision of the Dean of the Faculty based on the standing of the applicant and on the limit of the maximum number of applicants admitted. The Dean of the Faculty has the right to invite the applicant to attend an interview and the right to set the number of points awarded in the admission procedure individually.

The main criterion for admission for studies is to finish bachelor (undergraduate) study programme in related field of study and the average results of the previous studies. Important condition of admission procedure is to pass Aptitude test and English test.

Entry Requirements

- Proof of completed Bachelor degree officially recognised in the Slovak Republic (see Recognition of prior studies)
- Transcript of subjects completed – first degree of study (supplement to the diploma) and transcript of marks attained
- Filled in Application Form with all supplements
- Curriculum vitae (original signed by the candidate)
- Medical certificate stating the health condition of the applicant

Final Examinations

The condition for the successful completion of the study programme Business Economics is a final examination (§ 63/1 of Law 131/2002 on Higher Education), including the final thesis defence. Questions for core and optional courses are drawn for each subject separately. Each part of the final examination and overall assessment of the final thesis is classified separately. Parts of the final exam are: 1) Master's Thesis defence
2) Oral defence of core and optional courses
