Admission Procedure

The admission of an applicant for studies at the Faculty of Economics and Management is done according to the decision of the Dean of the Faculty based on the standing of the applicant and on the limit of the maximum number of applicants admitted. The Dean of the Faculty has the right to invite the applicant to attend an interview and the right to set the number of points awarded in the admission procedure individually. The main criterion for admission for studies is to pass Aptitude test and English test.

Final Examinations

The condition for the successful completion of the study programme International business with agrarian commodities is a final examination (§ 63/1 of Law 131/2002 on Higher Education), including the final thesis defence. Questions for core and optional courses are drawn for each subject separately. Each part of the final examination and overall assessment of the final thesis is classified separately.
